Thoughts from the AAUW PA State Convention

Although I was unable to attend the two full days of convention, as I had planned, I still left energized, with some great ideas and new contacts. Meeting members from around the state and hearing what other branches are doing is always the best part of these meetings. It is my hope that the next convention sees more members from our branch take advantage of the opportunity to attend.

One of the keynote speakers was Julie Vogtman, Director of Job Quality and Senior Counsel at the National Women's Law Center. She presented a research report entitled "Resilient But Not Recovered: After Two Years of the COVID-19 Crisis, Women Are Still Struggling." The report undertook new research to gain a deeper understanding of the impact of the pandemic on women and their families. The results are sobering, but unfortunately, not surprising. This brings up the AAUW PA Public Policy chairs' very interesting handout: Economic Equity Issues and Relevant Pennsylvania Legislation. It lists the AAUW PA policy issues and the corresponding PA proposed legislation. I will get a copy of this handout to everyone in the near future.

The Landsdale Branch gave a presentation on a recent initiative of theirs: "Helping Non-Traditional Students Cross the Finish Line." This is a scholarship and mentoring program done in conjunction with Philadelphia Community College. I am excited to present some of their ideas to our Board explore the possibility of enhancing our own endowed scholarship program with Penn Highlands. Especially in light of the report by the National Women's Law Center, perhaps we should take another look at non-traditional students.

Thanks to Paula Tomko, who attended the convention in her State Board capacity.

I had lunch with some women from the West Chester-Chester County Branch who have an interesting program, combining the Gateway to Equity Award with Community Outreach Service projects. The Community Outreach Chair, Eva Kaufmann is willing to do a brief Zoom meeting with our Board to explain their approach.

Again, it was a brief but energizing experience, and one I look forward to discussing further with all of you.
