The Education/Scholarship committee met in August to review procedures and criteria for selecting scholarship recipients. In light of declining local student enrollments which reduces the number of eligible candidates plus changing economic conditions, the committee voted to present to the Board for approval the following recommendations.

- 1. That the scholarship award be increased from \$1500 to \$2000 to be evaluated annually.
- 2. That the criteria for selection be increased from top 10% to top 15% of the graduating class.
- 3. That, although we have no means to ascertain financial need, we stress to the counselors that they take need into consideration when choosing the female recipient from the top 15%.

The three schools in rotation this year are Richland, Forest Hills, and GJCTC. They will be contacted in January.

The Scholarship/ Awards Banquet will be held at 1:00 PM Sunday, April 2 2023 at Sunnehanna Country Club.
